

Washington Township employs six full-time operators in our Public Works Department. They maintain 58 miles of township roads. In addition, they are responsible for snow plowing on 14 miles of state roads. We have seen substantial improvement in the condition of township roads in the past five years with 26.4 miles of roads being re-shaped and/or paved.

Looking ahead to winter snow plowing

Snow should be plowed or shoveled to the right side of the driveway as you are facing the intersecting road. By plowing away from the direction of oncoming snow plows, this action will prevent the bulk of the snow from being pushed back onto the driveway. Eliminate snow piles at the driveway entrance whenever possible. **Do not push snow out onto roads at any time.** This creates hazardous driving conditions for all vehicles. Homeowners can be held responsible for accidents which result after snow has been shoveled onto township maintained roads. The Township is asking the public's cooperation by following the preceding guidelines.
