IMPORTANT NOTICE FROM YOUR TAX COLLECTOR-PLEASE READ

As of December 2025, the postal system has made some changes in regard to your mail and postmarks.

From the USPS website:

While we are not changing our postmarking practices, we have made adjustments to our transportation operations that will result in some mailpieces not arriving at our originating processing facilities on the same day that they are mailed. This means that the date on the postmarks applied at our processing facilities will not necessarily match the date on which the customer's mailpiece was collected by a letter carrier or dropped off at a retail location.

As before, a customer can ensure that a postmark is applied to his or her mailpiece, and that the date on the postmark matches the date of mailing, by visiting a Postal Service retail location and requesting a manual (local) postmark at the retail counter when tendering their mailpiece. Manual postmarks will be applied free of charge.

HOW THIS CAN AFFECT YOU:

According to the Tax Collector manual, our office has to accept tax payments that are mailed in based upon their postmark. Therefore, if your payment is not postmarked before the due date, our office has to reject it. This in turn will mean a higher cost to you.

Moving forward, please try to mail your payments at least one week before due. If that is not possible, you will need to go into the post office to make sure it is manually postmarked prior to the due date.

This change may affect your other bills, voting, taxes etc... so please be diligent and aware.

Residents can bring any outdated or unwanted prescription or over-the-counter pills, inhalers, ointments, creams, sprays and pet medicines.

Medicines should be deposited in sealed bottles, bags or other containers; patient information can be removed or crossed out.

Needles and injectable drugs will not be accepted.

2025 Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program

The application period for the state's 2025 Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program is now open for eligible Pennsylvanians to begin claiming rebates on property taxes or rent paid last year.

Income limits increased again this year to \$48,110 for both homeowners and renters. Remember to exclude 50% of Social Security when determining your income. The maximum rebate is \$1,000.

The program is open to residents aged 65 years and older; widows and widowers 50 years and older; and people with disabilities 18 years and older.

Remember – you do not need to pay anyone for assistance to apply for the rebates. Apply online at mypath.pa.gov or contact my office at 724-387-9113 or 724-472-

Heating Assistance Program Available

If bitter cold temperatures have left you struggling with your home heating bills, help may be available through the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP).

LIHEAP is a federally funded program that helps individuals and families pay their heating bills through home heating energy assistance grants. It also provides crisis grants to help in the event of an emergency or if a resident is in danger of losing his or her heat due to broken equipment, lack of fuel or termination of utility service.



To qualify for LIHEAP in Pennsylvania, you must meet income requirements, which are set based on your household size. For example, the maximum annual income for an individual is \$23,475 and for a family of four it is \$48,225. For each additional person, add \$8,250 to the income limit.

If you're a Pennsylvania veteran with a disability, you may be eligible for an exemption on your real estate taxes! Veterans are eligible if they have served during a war or armed conflict, have a 100% permanent or total VA disability rating and have been discharged under other than dishonorable mention. DEP Reminds Pennsylvania Residents to Test Homes for Radon

The state Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) is encouraging Pennsylvanians to test their homes for radon during Radon Action Month, bringing public awareness to a very serious health hazard.

"Radon is the second-leading cause of lung cancer after smoking in the United States, and is a serious concern within the Commonwealth, but it is also very easy to protect yourself and your family from this naturally occurring gas," said DEP Secretary Jessica Shirley.

"January is a great month to pick up a test kit from the local hardware store, put it on the lowest floor of your house, and find out if your home has radon. Radon test kits are also at many home improvement and hardware stores and typically cost \$20-\$30.

Even homes that have mitigation systems installed should test their homes every two years.

Permanent radon mitigation systems typically cost between \$800 and \$1,200 and require minimal maintenance. A list of state-certified radon contractors, labs, and testers is available on [DEP's website](#). The public is encouraged to call DEP's Radon Division at 717-783-3594, or the Radon Hotline at 800-237-2366, for help with interpreting their test results and what follow-up action may be necessary.

## Kindergarten Enrollment - NOW OPEN!

To register your child, [CLICK HERE](#) or go to the link on the district website under Registration. You will then be directed to a New Student Enrollment: Account Request. Once you complete the request, an email will be sent to you including your login and password to begin registration.

If you already have a student in the district, you can access the link in Family Access by logging into Skyward.

If you do not have access to register online, packets are available at the Central Administrative Office or any district school. Once complete, packets must be turned into the Central Administrative Office.

All incoming students will need the following to register. Documents can be uploaded when completing the registration online. If you are unable to upload, you may bring the paperwork to the Administration Office **BETWEEN THE HOURS 7:30 AM - 3:30 PM.**

- Student's Birth Certificate
- Student's Immunization Records
- Two Proofs of Parent/Guardian's Residency

**BEFORE** September 1st to register  
for kindergarten.

Think Twice Before Stepping On Ice

After a stretch of cold weather, ice can form on rivers, ponds, lakes, and streams across Pennsylvania. While frozen waterways may look solid, ice conditions can change quickly and are often more dangerous than they appear. Ice is rarely uniform. Moving water, changing temperatures, snow cover, and debris can all weaken ice from below.



Rivers and streams are especially unpredictable because currents keep ice thinner and less stable, even during prolonged cold periods. What looks safe from the shore can give way without warning.

If you enjoy winter activities near the water, it is important to use caution. Avoid walking, skating, or riding vehicles on frozen rivers and streams. Even ponds and lakes can have weak spots, especially near inlets, outlets, docks, and areas with flowing water underneath.

If someone falls through the ice, call 911 immediately. Do not attempt a rescue by stepping onto the ice yourself. Reach for the person with a long object if possible and stay low and spread out to reduce your own risk.

As temperatures rise and fall throughout winter, ice conditions can change day to day or even hour to hour. The safest choice is to stay off frozen waterways and enjoy winter scenery from a safe distance. A moment of caution can prevent a life-threatening emergency.




